Focus on activity: clothes

Target audience (age): Fundamental 1

Lesson link: Fun Way 4, Unit 5; Kids Web 4, Unit 4.

Aim: practicing clothes vocabulary and using "What are you wearing?".

Duration: 20-30 min

Organization: group work

Material: magazines, scissors, glue, worksheets

Preparation: bring magazines, have worksheet copies ready.

Preparation:

Procedure:

- Tell each student an item of clothes vocabulary such as hat, cap, coat, skirt, socks, boots, T-shirt, shirt, pants, dress, sneakers, top, sweater, jacket, flip-flops, shoes, jeans, shorts. The words can be repeated.
- Have students sit down in a circle.
- Say for example: "Stand up <u>hat</u>, <u>shoes</u> and <u>coat." Then</u> say: "Switch chairs."
- Students stand up, and move to different chairs.
- Keep changing the commands so that everybody can play.
- Bring magazines and have each student choose a person to describe in a fashion show, and cut it out.
- Have a classmate ask "What's he / she wearing?" and let the student introduce the character and its clothes. Students can stand up, or walk around the classroom with their "models".
- Hand students the worksheets and ask them to glue their "models" and describe what they're wearing
 in writing.

Wrap up:

Divide students into groups of four. Ask them to prepare five scrambled words about the clothes
vocabulary. One of the students of each group comes to the board and writes a scrambled word each
turn. The other groups have 30 seconds to figure it out. Score one point for each correct guess. Check
the winner by the end of five turns.
